## 4. First-aid measures

Description of necessary measures, subdivided according to the different routes of exposure, i.e., inhalation, skin and eye contact, and ingestion:

**Inhalation:**

If symptoms are experienced remove source of contamination or move victim to fresh air and obtain medical advice.

**Eye Contact:**

Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 20 minutes retracting eyelids often. Tilt the head to prevent chemical from transferring to the uncontaminated eye. Get immediate medical attention and monitor the eye daily as advised by your physician.

Immediately flush with plenty of water. After initial flushing, remove any contact lenses and continue flushing for at least 15 minutes. Have eyes examined and tested by medical personnel.

**Skin Contact:**

Wash with soap and water. Remove contaminated clothing and launder. Get medical attention if irritation develops or persists.

**Ingestion:**

Do not induce vomiting and seek medical attention immediately. Provide medical care provider with this SDS. If vomiting occurs, lean victim forward to reduce risk of aspiration into lungs.

**Most important symptoms/effects, acute and delayed:**

Causes skin irritation. Suspected of damaging fertility or the unborn child. Causes damage to organs

**Indication of immediate medical attention and special treatment needed, if necessary:**

Consult a physician. Treat symptomatically.

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## 5. Fire-fighting measures

### Suitable (and unsuitable) extinguishing media:

**Suitable extinguishing media:** Use alcohol resistant foam, carbon dioxide, dry chemical, or water spray when fighting fires. Water or foam may cause frothing if liquid is burning but it still may be a useful extinguishing agent if carefully applied to the fire.

**Unsuitable extinguishing media:** Do not use water jet as an extinguisher, as this will spread the fire.

### Specific hazards arising from the chemical:

Vapors may be ignited by sparks, flames or other sources of ignition if material is above the flash point giving rise to a fire (Class B). Vapors are heavier than air and may travel to a source of ignition and flash back. Use process enclosures to control the level of dust in the air. Empty containers that retain product residue (liquid, solid/sludge, or vapor) can be dangerous. Do not pressurize, cut, weld, braze, solder, drill, grind, or expose container to heat, flame, sparks, static electricity, or other sources of ignition. Any of these actions can potentially cause an explosion that may lead to injury or death.

**Hazardous combustion products:** Oxides of carbon, Toxic fumes, Toxic gases, Sulfur oxides, Hydrocarbons

### Special protective equipment and precautions for fire-fighters:

Do not enter fire area without proper protection including self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective equipment. Fight fire from a safe distance and a protected location due to the potential of hazardous vapors and decomposition products.

## 6. Accidental release measures

### Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures:

Exposure to the spilled material may be irritating or harmful. Follow personal protective equipment recommendations found in Section 8 of this SDS. Additional precautions may be necessary based on special circumstances created by the spill including; the material spilled, the quantity of the spill, the area in which the spill occurred. Also consider the expertise of employees in the area responding to the spill.

### Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up:

Absorb or cover with dry earth, sand or other non-combustible material and transfer to appropriate waste containers. Use clean, non-sparking tools to collect absorbed material. Collect and discard in accordance with local, state and national regulations.

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## 7. Handling and storage

**Precautions for safe handling:** Avoid contacting and avoid breathing the material. Use only in a well ventilated area. "Empty" containers retain product residue (liquid and/or vapor) and can be dangerous. Ground and bond containers when transferring material. Do not get in eyes, on skin and clothing. Wash thoroughly after handling. As with all chemicals, good industrial hygiene practices should be followed when handling this material.

**Safe storage conditions:** Store in a cool dry ventilated location. Isolate from incompatible materials and conditions. Keep container(s) closed. Do not store in direct sunlight. Keep away from heat, sparks, and flame.

**Carcinogenicity:** Crystalline Silica: This product contains mined materials which generally contain small amounts of crystalline silica (CAS# 14808-60-7, quartz sand) above 0.1% as a naturally occurring impurity. IARC Monographs on the evaluations of the carcinogenic Risk of Chemicals to Humans (Volume 42, 1987) concludes that there is "limited evidence" of the carcinogenicity of crystalline silica to humans. IARC classification 2A. Crystalline silica in a coating product, either in wet or dry form, is encapsulated and unlikely to be present in small enough particles to present an inhalation risk. Normal dust precautions should be taken if the dry coating is to be severely abraded by sanding or sandblasting.
