### 4. First-aid measures

**Inhalation:**

If symptoms are experienced remove source of contamination or move victim to fresh air and obtain medical advice.

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<b>Eye Contact:</b>	Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 20 minutes retracting eyelids often. Tilt the head to prevent chemical from transferring to the uncontaminated eye. Get immediate medical attention and monitor the eye daily as advised by your physician.
<b>Skin Contact:</b>	Wash with soap and water. Remove contaminated clothing and launder. Get medical attention if irritation develops or persists.
<b>Ingestion:</b>	Do not induce vomiting and seek medical attention immediately. Provide medical care provider with this SDS.
<b>Most important symptoms/effects, acute and delayed:</b>	May cause respiratory irritation
<b>Indication of immediate medical attention and special treatment needed, if necessary:</b>	Consult a physician. Treat symptomatically.

## 5. Fire-fighting measures

### Suitable (and unsuitable) extinguishing media:

**Suitable extinguishing media:** Use alcohol resistant foam, carbon dioxide, dry chemical, or water spray when fighting fires. Water or foam may cause frothing if liquid is burning but it still may be a useful extinguishing agent if carefully applied to the fire.

**Unsuitable extinguishing media:** Do not use water jet as an extinguisher, as this will spread the fire.

### Specific hazards arising from the chemical:

Vapors may be ignited by sparks, flames or other sources of ignition if material is above the flash point giving rise to a fire (Class B). Vapors are heavier than air and may travel to a source of ignition and flash back. Empty containers that retain product residue (liquid, solid/sludge, or vapor) can be dangerous. Do not pressurize, cut, weld, braze, solder, drill, grind, or expose container to heat, flame, sparks, static electricity, or other sources of ignition. Any of these actions can potentially cause an explosion that may lead to injury or death.

### Special protective equipment and precautions for fire-fighters:

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## 6. Accidental release measures

### Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures:

### Precautions for safe handling:
